The Associate of Science in General Studies is a two-year program designed to help students transfer to a four-year college.

Take classes online or attend classes on-campus at the Greenbrier Valley Campus, Mercer County Campus, Nicholas County Campus and the Raleigh County Campus.

TRANSFER AGREEMENTS

Graduates from New River typically obtain employment or continue to a four-year school. We have articulation agreements with most of the area four-year colleges and universities, which means that students may obtain their first two years of a four-year degree at New River CTC then continue on (transfer) to the four-year school for the final two years. This 2+2 approach to obtaining a 4-year degree is typically more cost effective for students.
