SUBJECT: Posting Notification: Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act Report

The Student Right-To-Know Act, which was renamed The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act in 1998, mandates that institutions of higher education disclose information about crimes on and near their respective campuses.

New River Community and Technical College annually submits the Campus Crime Report based on the provisions of the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act. This information is submitted in the categories listed below for any crimes or incidents on campus, on public property adjoining campus and any incidents involving hate crimes. The data reported number and nature of crimes for the 2014 calendar year, Jan. 1 – Dec. 31.

The criminal offenses that the campus is required to report are the following offenses; murder/non-negligent manslaughter; negligent manslaughter; forcible sex offenses; non-forcible sex offenses, robbery, aggravated assault; burglary; motor vehicle theft, arson, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking. In addition, statistics concerning any of the above crimes that manifest evidence of a hate crime that the victim was intentionally selected because of the victims race, gender, religion, sexual orientation or ethnicity/national origin or disability, including other crimes that involve bodily injury that also manifest evidence of a hate crime. New River Community and Technical College is also required to report statistics for arrests in these categories only: liquor law violations, drug abuse violations, drug law violations, and illegal weapons possessions. The College's safety efforts are coordinated by an Emergency Response Team which manages emergency response planning and campus safety.

#### A. REPORTING OF CRIMES

New River Community and Technical College has contracted security officers so should a crime or suspected crime occur, the incident must be reported to the Security Officer or Director of Facilities and Campus Safety. (Security Contacts are posted on campus bulletin boards and the New River CTC web page under Safety and Security) Should the Security Officer not be available, the incident must be reported to a staff member. The Security Officer/staff member will file the proper report with the school Director of Facilities and Campus Safety. The President or Director of Facilities and Campus Safety will determine the appropriate actions to be taken except under extreme emergency situations when the Security Officer/staff member may call police/emergency rescue directly. The Director of Facilities and Campus Safety is also responsible for reporting legitimate incidents to the local public law enforcement authorities. In case of an emergency dial **911**, from a campus phone dial **9-911**.

## **B. CAMPUS ACCESS:**

Access to New River Community and Technical College facilities will be permitted during business hours to staff, students and other legitimate visitors as deemed appropriate by New River Community and Technical College. Access to school facilities during other than business hours is at the discretion of the Regional Director of Operations, Director of Facilities and Campus Safety or appropriate Executive Officer.

## **C. CAMPUS SECURITY INFORMATION DISSEMINATION:**

In addition to annual dissemination of campus security information to all students and employees, this information is to be presented during the orientation of new students and employees. A notice identifying the Campus Security Contacts is posted on the student bulletin boards and also available on the New River CTC web page under Safety/Security.

In the event of an emergency the following communication methods will be implemented in this order: email ([allusers@newriver.edu](mailto:allusers@newriver.edu)), Alert Messaging System (email, portal and text), post bulletins on the College's website home page and social media channels. Other notifications may be by telephone. This system is intended for the immediate transmission of specific information regarding an emergency to all affected areas of the campus/s.

## **D. CRIME PREVENTION AWARENESS:**

Each person is encouraged to be responsible for their own security and the security of others. It is important to travel in pairs particularly during the evening hours and to assist others by not leaving the parking lot on the evening hours until other students and staff are safely in their cars and their cars have started. Only carry enough money to cover your immediate needs and do not leave purses unattended. When leaving valuables in your vehicles, make sure they are not in view of others. Be sensitive and observant of any unusual circumstances and/or people and report any unusual occurrences to the Campus Security Officer.

#### J. CRIME DEFINITIONS

The following are reportable crimes and their definitions. The definitions are taken from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI's) Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook (UCR).

- a. Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter: the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. NOTE: Deaths caused by negligence, attempts to kill, assaults to kill, suicide, accidental deaths, and justifiable homicides are excluded.

- b. Negligent Manslaughter: the killing of another person through gross negligence.
- c. Sex Offenses–Forcible: any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- d. Forcible Rape: the carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against the person’s will; or not forcibly or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth).
- e. Forcible Sodomy: oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly and/or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
- f. Sexual Assault With An Object: the use of an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
- g. Forcible Fondling: the touching of the private parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or, not forcibly and/or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
- h. Sex Offenses–Non-Forcible: unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse (limited to incest and statutory rape)
- i. Incest: the non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.
- j. Statutory Rape: the non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.
- k. Robbery: the taking or attempting to take anything of value of the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- l. Aggravated Assault: an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury resulted from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife or other weapon is used which could or probably would result in a serious potential injury if the crime were successfully completed.
- m. Burglary: the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. For reporting purposes this definition includes: unlawful entry with intent to commit a larceny or a felony; breaking and entering with the intent to commit a larceny; housebreaking; safecracking; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.
- n. Motor Vehicle Theft: the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. (Classify as motor vehicle theft all cases where automobiles are taken by persons not having lawful access, even though the vehicles are later abandoned – including joy riding).
- o. Arson: the willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn with or without intent to defraud a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, or personal property of another kind.

Along with the above listed crimes it is a requirement to report arrests and campus disciplinary referrals for the following offenses:

- p. Liquor Law Violations: the violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, transportation, furnishing, possessing of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned. (Drunkenness and driving under the influence are not included in this definition.)
- q. Drug Abuse Violations: violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include opium or cocaine and their derivatives; morphine, heroin, codeine; marijuana; synthetic narcotics (Demerol, Methadone); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (Barbiturates, Benzedrine).
- r. Weapon Law Violations: the violation of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as; manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; furnishing deadly weapons to minor; alien possessing weapons and all attempts of the aforementioned.
