NAIL CARE TECHNICIAN ADVANCED SKILL SET CERTIFICATE (ASSC) [PROGRAM HOURS: 14]

The Nail Care Technician program consists of 400 contact hours as required for licensure by the West Virginia Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists. Students must have a high school diploma or equivalent (GED) to enroll in this program.

Nail Care Technician services include the cleaning, shaping, conditioning and care for the fingers, hands, toes and feet as well as the preparation and application of artificial nails. Physical requirements include finger dexterity, negative allergic reaction to cosmetic preparations and artistic flair for creative design. The nail technician should enjoy working with the public and in a team atmosphere. People skills and time management skills are essential.

Students must present a copy of their license to be awarded the advanced skill set certificate. State and federal financial aid are not available for advanced skill set certificates.

ESTHETICS CERTIFICATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE (CAS) [PROGRAM HOURS: 30]



The esthetics program is a branch of the cosmetology focusing on skin care and makeup. The certificate program consists of 30 credit hours of instruction of both theoretical and practical skill development as required for licensure by the West Virginia Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists and exceeds the 600 clock hours required.

The program requires a GPA of 2.0 or higher. Licensing or certification exams are independent of graduation requirements.

Upon completion of the Esthetics program, students will be eligible for the examination administered by the Board provided all eligibility requirements are met.

Focus on a career oriented program in salon management and cosmetology. Gain hands-on experience in the Cosmetology Program Salon. This program exceeds the 1800 clock hours required by the West Virginia Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists. Students will be eligible to take the State board examination provided all eligibility requirements are met.

Exams are independent of graduation requirements.
